Hoping to travel for your studies this year?

Apply for the Dailey Family Travel Award!

The Department invites Art and Art History majors and minors to apply for the Dailey Family Travel Award to support individual research travel. The award provides a stipend of up to \$1500 for travel expenses to pursue a project in the visual arts. Art students may, for example, travel to develop or enhance a body of work for their senior exhibition, a course, or another opportunity. Art History students might design the travel for research (museums, libraries, archives, etc.) toward a course, senior thesis, or independent project. Applicants develop brief proposals in consultation with a faculty member who will supervise the project.

Eligibility Requirements

The applicant must be a 1) sophomore or junior and 2) declared major or minor in Studio Art or Art History. Travel by the awardee must take place in Summer 2017, Fall 2017, or Spring 2018. The student will register for a 1-credit course (either ARTS 301 or ARTH 301) in Fall 2017 or Spring 2018 to provide for faculty supervision and transcript indication of the travel project. If the awardee has dedicated the travel specifically to a senior project (ARTS) or thesis (ARTH), registration for ARTS 499 or ARTH 490 replaces the 1-credit course requirement.

Recipients

Awardees will be honored at the Misty Dailey Awards Ceremony on April 27, 2017, where they will be presented with a certificate. A reception and dinner will follow. Recipients will be notified in advance of their awards. Recipients of the Dailey Family Travel Award will be asked to make a short presentation about results of their travel and projects during the subsequent Misty Dailey Awards Ceremony, in April 2018.

The Dailey Family Travel Awards are sponsored by the Robert E. Dailey, Sr. Family, Benefactors of the Annual Misty Dailey Awards in the Department of Art and Art History.

Application Guidelines

Applicants must identify a project and explain how the travel award will help them achieve their goals. The strongest proposals will have a clearly defined objectives and end result: for example, creation of a portfolio (analog or digital) of artwork for a senior thesis; or notes on research for a thesis, independent study, or graduate application.

Please compose an essay of up to 500 words (1-2 typed, double-spaced pages) describing your project and the proposed itinerary and activities. Provide as much specific information as possible. Explain how the project relates to courses you have taken or other relevant experience. The application must be accompanied by a brief line-item budget indicating approximate expenses for travel, lodging, and associated costs (such as museum admissions).

The research travel is carried out under the sponsorship of a faculty member from the Department of Art and Art History. The professor should be someone familiar with the student's work who can advise on the process of research travel. For this reason, applicants should meet with a faculty sponsor ahead of time to develop the project proposal. No submissions will be accepted without the approval and signature of a faculty sponsor on the application form.

Submit the proposal with the signature of your faculty sponsor to Maggie Ayres in the department office (Walsh 102) by **noon on Wednesday, April 19, 2017.**
